


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

Leaps In Happiness Results

In order to achieve Dubai Courts> strategy and its mission to attain effective and accurate justice that provides accessible judicial services to all, the year 2022 witnessed more progress in most happiness indicators across the courts, and in the internal and external environments, in support of its goal of supporting the quality of life.


Happiness questionnaires in the Courts revealed that

the happiness index among customers reached 97%, while maintaining happiness rates close to previous years in the indicators of happiness of employees, society, partners, suppliers, and online and smart services.

Regarding the question about the extent of happiness, the percentage of customers jumped to 94%, significantly ahead of 61% in 2021.



Results Of Happiness Indicators At Dubai Courts*










Outstanding performance in applying the customer complaints system





Each court is headed by a president whose rank is Appeals Judge at least, all headed by the president of the First Instance Courts whose rank is Senior Appeals Judge at least.


Structure of Judicial Circuits:

The judicial circuits are composed of a single judge, except for the Grand Criminal Court which comprises three judges.


Jurisdiction of First Instance Courts


Average Judgment Term From First Hearing (Day)









Average Judgment Term From Registration Date (Day)





One of the specialized courts under the First Instance Courts, headed by a president whose rank is no less than an Appeals Judge, and reports administratively to the president of First Instance Courts. The court specializes in personal status cases, such as:

- 1. Personal Status of Muslims.
- 2. Personal Status of Non-Muslims.
- 3. Money Matters of Muslims.
- 4. Money Matters of Non-Muslims.
- 5. Inheritance of Muslims.
- 6. Inheritance of Non-Muslims
- 7. Inclusion and Exclusion of Heir (Muslims).
- 8. Inclusion and Exclusion of Heir (Non- Muslims).
- 9. Certifications and Attestations.

About Personal Status Litigations


The Court hears all litigations and disputes related to personal status, such as cases of personal status, including divorce, alimony, custody, etc. The court also hears cases related to money affairs, such as cases of interdiction, the appointment and removal of a custodian, or permission to sell or invest the funds of a minor and the like, as well as the attestation of legal marriage contracts for Muslims and civil marriage contracts for non-Muslims, testimonies of wills, issuance of legal notices, determination of heirs, registration of inheritance files for inventory and distribution, confirmation of agreements related thereto, as well as issuance of divorce certificates, attestation of related agreements and other certificates related to the marital status of community members in the Emirate of Dubai according to legal jurisdiction.

Structure of the Court


The court is composed of partial judicial circuits headed by a single judge who manages and adjudicates them according to the sessions and times set for each circuit, bearing in mind that all the

sessions of these circuits are secret sessions that are attended only by the parties to the case and their legal representatives and those authorized by the court such as witnesses, family arbitrators, experts or others.

Average Judgment Term From First Hearing





Criminal Court of First Instance

About the Court and its Jurisdiction

One of the specialized courts under the First Instance Courts, headed by a president whose rank is no less than an Appeals Judge, and reports administratively to the president of First Instance Courts. The court specializes in hearing and adjudicating all crimes such as felonies, misdemeanors, violations and punishable acts in accordance with the penal laws applicable and in force in the State..

The court comprises a number of circuits as follows:


- 1- Major criminal circuits, which are specialized in crimes punishable by death and life imprisonment.
- 2- Minor criminal circuits, which are specialized in crimes punishable by temporary imprisonment.
- 3- Misdemeanor circuits, which are specialized in misdemeanors punishable by imprisonment or fines.
- 4- Traffic misdemeanor circuits, which are specialized in adjudicating traffic misdemeanors and violations.
- 5- Immigration and nationality misdemeanors circuits, specialized in crimes stipulated in the Law Regarding Entry And Residence Of Aliens.
- 6- Juvenile criminal circuits, specialized in crimes committed by juveniles in accordance with the applicable juveniles law in the State.
- 7- Family Misdemeanors circuit, which specializes in adjudicating crimes that fall within the scope of the same family.
- 8- Money Laundering circuit, specialized in money laundering misdemeanors that are punishable as per the applicable legislation in the State.
- 9- One-Day Misdemeanors circuits.




Estate Court of First Instance

About the Court and its Jurisdiction

One of the specialized courts under the First Instance Courts, headed by a president whose rank is no less than an Appeals Judge, and reports administratively to the president of First Instance Courts. The court specializes in hearing disputes and conflicts resulting and emanating from urgent transactions and contracts related to property rights, any in-kind or subsidiary rights, and rental relationships that exceed ten years. Examples for litigations that fall within the court's jurisdiction include, but are not limited to:

- Real estate disputes of any value.
- Validity and execution of real estate contracts litigations.
- Litigations related to the annulment and termination of real estate contracts.
- Financial leasing disputes.
- Leasing disputes for long-term contracts exceeding ten years.
- · Partition, distribution and splitting litigations.
- · Judicial receivership of common funds.
- Real estate transfer litigation.
- · Compensations related to real estate disputes.


One of the specialized courts under the First Instance Courts, headed by a president whose rank is no less than an Appeals Judge, and reports administratively to the president of First Instance Courts. The court specializes in hearing and adjudicating disputes and conflicts arising from commercial transactions and contracts, including but not limited to:

- · Commercial contract litigations.
- · Banking litigations.
- Intellectual property litigations.
- Litigations of commercial companies and corporations, and commercial securities.
- · Commercial agencies and exclusive distribution litigations.
- · Maritime and air dispute litigations.
- Cases of initiating and announcing bankruptcy procedures and grievances thereof.
- Orders of payment.
- Grievance against payment orders within jurisdiction.




Execution Court

About the Court and its Jurisdiction


One of the specialized courts under the First Instance Courts, headed by a president who reports administratively to the president of First Instance Courts. It consists of several circuits, each headed by a single judge. It specializes in hearing and adjudicating the execution of executive documents and all temporary and substantive execution disputes, except for those excluded by the law by a special provision, such as movable recovery litigation and the real estate entitlement litigation. The specializations of this court also include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Executing judgments issued by Dubai courts of all types, except criminal courts.
- 2. Executing judgments issued by Dubai International Financial Center (DIFC).
- 3. Executing judicial deputations inside and outside the State.
- 4. Executing foreign judgments.
- 5. Imposing provisional attachments.
- 6. Urgent litigations.
- 7. Orders on petitions.
- 8. Adjudicating execution disputes.
- 9. Adjudicating grievances.
- 10. Real estate sales.






Judge decision making rate





Appeal Court

About the Court

The Court of Appeals is the second degree of litigation in the Emirate of Dubai. It is composed of a president whose rank is not less than a cassation judge and a sufficient number of judges. The most senior judge in the Court of Appeals replaces the president of the court in his absence and exercises the powers specified for him by law. The Court of Appeals comprises a number of judicial circuits to hear objections and requests; each circuit consists of three judges presided over by one of them.

Structure of the Court

The Court of Appeals consists of the following circuits:

- Civil circuits.
- Administrative circuits.
- Commercial circuits.
- Real estate circuits.
- Labor circuits.
- Personal status circuits.
- Urgent matters and execution circuits.
- · Arbitration litigations and requests circuits.
- Criminal circuits.

Court's Specializations

The court specializes in hearing and adjudicating appeals filed against judgments, decisions, and orders, that may be appealed by law, issued by courts of first instance of all types (civil, administrative, commercial, real estate, labor, urgent matters and execution, personal status, penal) in accordance with articles 159 to 170 and article 209 of the Civil Procedures Law No.




Average Judgment Term From First Hearing











Rate of Cases in circulation for more than one year



Processing rate





Court of Supreme

About the Court

The Dubai Court of Cassation was established pursuant to Law No. (1) of 1988 issued on 6/2/1988. It is the only court of cassation at the emirate level and the highest in the judicial system. It aims to unify the application of the law in Dubai courts, as it does not re-adjudicate disputes that have been presented to lower courts, but rather monitors the extent to which the rulings issued by those courts agree with the law, and it may decide on the dispute that is brought before it in its capacity as a court of subject matter and not a court of law as is the case, if the dispute is brought before it for the second time.


Structure of the Court

- The Court of Cassation consists of a president and a sufficient number of judges, and the most senior judge replaces the president in his absence.
- The court consists of a group of commercial, real estate, civil, administrative, labor, personal status, and penal circuits, and a judgment recourse circuit. A decision is issued by the court's president to establish and form these circuits and define their terms of reference, and the number of judges in each circuit is at least three.

Cassation Court's Specializations

The court specializes in hearing objections submitted thereto against rulings issued by the Court of Appeals in civil, administrative, commercial and labor cases, and in personal status cases in accordance with the value jurisdiction stipulated in the law, in addition to rulings issued in criminal cases in matters of felonies and misdemeanors, as well as other jurisdictions stipulated in the laws.







Special Court of Inheritance: Quality Judiciary that Simplifies Procedures

The Special Court of Inheritance was established by Resolution no. 6 of 2022 dated 15/4/2022 issued by His Highness Sheikh Maktoum bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai and Chairman of the Judicial Council.

Beginnings

On 26 February 2018, the Director General of Dubai Courts launched the C3 Court platform as part of the UAE Innovation Week 2018. The concept is to create the world's first court that integrates the three levels of litigation in one circuit. It issues final judgments that can be executed immediately with updated and simplified procedures that shorten litigation time. Federal legislation adopted this project and included

Federal legislation adopted this project and included it in the Civil Procedures Law and its organizational regulations in accordance with their latest amendments under the name (Special Courts), and authorized the federal and local judicial authorities to issue the appropriate decisions regarding the organization of the function of this court.

Based on the directives of His Highness Sheikh Maktoum bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai and Chairman of the Judicial Council, to prepare a draft decision to organize the function of these courts, beginning with inheritance claims, all concerned authorities, under the supervision of the General Secretariat of the Judicial Council and Dubai Courts, immediately began implementing the directives of His Highness until the decision to establish them was issued.

Objectives

The establishment of the court came with the aim of preserving social and family ties, and

protecting them from disputes that may arise due to inheritance, in addition to combining lawsuits and requests related to or arising from inheritance in one case before one judicial authority instead of distributing them to more than one judicial authority as a result of applying jurisdiction, and shortening litigation procedures to be at the same level the speed of adjudication of inheritance claims without prejudice to the requirements of prompt justice, in addition to the establishment of a qualitative judiciary specialized in inheritance claims, which is able to adjudicate in them as well as the claims and requests that derive from them, and to extend procedural flexibility in inheritance claims, which require innovative judicial solutions.

Judgments

The judgments of the Special Court of Inheritance are final and not subject to appeal except by requesting reconsideration in accordance with the legally prescribed circumstances.

They are implemented without the need for declaration, and no appeal or grievance is accepted. An order may be issued to stop their execution by a decision of the court if a petition for reconsideration or a request to withdraw the judgment is submitted.

Structure

The Special Court of Inheritance comprises:

Judicial circuits: These are full circuits, each comprising a cassation judge, an Appeals judge and a first instance judge considering the diversity of the qualitative jurisdiction of the circuit according to the nature of the dispute presented.

Preparation Judge: He is tasked with receiving the inheritance file, preparing the case, giving it the correct adaptation, presenting the settlement to the parties, completing its procedures, and issuing a decision approving it when agreed upon, and he has the powers of the inheritance judge, the supervising judge, and the director of the case office stipulated in the law, and he expresses his opinion in writing in the dispute when settlement is not possible before submitting it to the judicial circuit.

Guarantees for Proper Administration of Justice:

- The parties to the dispute receive a legal opinion before the case is considered before the court by the preparation judge, who presents the settlement and provides solutions thereto and guiding support that saves them the trouble of litigation, incurring fees, and being satisfied with alternative solutions after revealing the nature of the dispute between them.
- The parties benefit frowm the provision of alternative dispute resolution services such as reconciliation and mediation during the case preparation stage.
- The opinion of the preparation judge is not binding on the judicial circuit, and therefore whoever insists on resorting to litigation is reassured that the opinion of the preparation judge has no effect on the judgment in the case.
- The ruling issued by this court may be reversed in specific cases, based on a request or on its own initiative.
- A petition for reconsideration may be submitted in accordance with the legally prescribed circumstances.







Strengthening Family Bonds and Cohesion


Dubai Courts entered into an agreement with the Community Development Authority, with the aim of strengthening cooperation relations between the two parties to enhance family bonds and cohesion by providing councils and community centers to facilitate the parties> meeting with arbitrators, providing services and handling family cases in appropriate places.


Case Preparation: Technical support for judges

The technical role of the Cases Department is to support the judges of the courts (first instance, appeal, and cassation). This support is characterized in the technical work of cases, starting from preparing the case file and managing its sessions in all stages of litigation, beginning with receiving the case files from the Central Services Department until preparing the case file for the competent court, checking the files of first instance cases in terms of judicial fees determined by law, and ensuring the correctness of the data recorded in the system electronically.

The Case Management Department also assesses the availability of the terms of the performance order, by presenting the cases to the supervising judge before referring them to the competent performance order judge, ensuring the translation of documents and assigning the parties to the case to submit notes and documents for the purpose of completing the legal procedures for preparing cases in addition to making special decisions for notifying the parties to the case, authorizing investigations, issuing announcement decisions by publication in accordance with the procedures specified in the Civil Procedures Law, ensuring the correct representation of persons and companies by examining the legal agencies submitted, proving the presence of the litigants, their requests and legal defenses in the minutes of the sessions, and managing and following up on the implementation of the decisions.


with the aim of applying prompt justice.

Expert Emiratization














Best Professional Training for Judiciary Staff

Dubai Courts is keen to provide members of the judiciary with the best professional training to provide them with modern knowledge in the judicial field, which helps them attain their desired goals in achieving the department's mission represented in achieving effective justice characterized by accuracy and speed in providing easily accessible judicial

services to all. Dubai Courts has cooperated with the Dubai Judicial Institute In the implementation of the Technical Skills Diploma "Accounting, Banking and Engineering" for 22 judges of various degrees of litigation in Dubai Courts, in coordination with the specialized authorities (Association of Accountants -Society of Engineers - Federation of Emirates Banks).



Initiatives that Reinforce Skills and Capabilities

Integrated program for preparing and qualifying the judges of tomorrow

Dubai Courts was keen to prepare and qualify 22 case managers by providing them with legal and judicial information and skills and enabling them to occupy the judicial profession. This came through the implementation of an integrated program for the first batch of case managers, as the program included the implementation of 15 legal, judicial and administrative training courses, and the program also included the implementation of visits to a number of external entities, including the Dubai International Financial Center Courts and the General Department of Forensic Evidence and Criminology at Dubai Police. Nine workshops were also implemented on how to create and draft judicial rulings, which was a requirement for practical application in the program. It also included conducting tests to measure the level of each trainee in how to manage the case file and write judicial rulings.



Enhancing Employees' Mental and Physical Health

Dubai Courts pays great attention to enhancing the mental and physical health of employees, in line with their needs, and with the aim of achieving the principle of happiness and well-being for them. From this standpoint, Dubai Courts has adopted many initiatives, including:

• Something on Your Mind Initiative: Based on the results of the questionnaires that were prepared to evaluate the workshops that were organized, this initiative was implemented and included various topics related to the employee's mental and physical health, in addition to the results of measuring the employees' opinions about the initiative.

The initiative also included the provision of psychological and family counseling, which was provided to employees in cooperation with specialized counseling centers. Criminal Court of First Instance: Strategic initiatives that consolidate the rule of law

The Criminal Court of First Instance established its distinction during the year 2022, after the end of the years 2020 and 2021 full of challenges left by the Covid-19 pandemic, as it continued to implement its ambitious plans and strategy. The pandemic and its repercussions have given it more experience and flexibility, to deal with various circumstances and conditions, to keep pace with development and modernization, and to deal efficiently with emergencies and challenges.

During the year 2022, the Court, in cooperation with the Public Prosecution and the Dubai Police General Command. launched strategic initiatives aimed at consolidating the rule of law, achieving prompt justice in order to reach the right and preserve freedoms, and these initiatives included many aspects, including legislative, technical and others.

Cooperation with the Public Prosecution

The Criminal Court of First Instance held several training courses to train its judges and develop their performance technically and electronically by working with the online program prepared by the Public Prosecution, as well as providing the necessary tools for that work, aiming to facilitate the litigation before the judge, which contributed to the completion of trials and the speedy settlement of cases. other criminal legislation.

Cooperation with the Dubai Police **General Command**

The Criminal Court of First Instance contributed significantly in cooperation with the Public Prosecution in Dubai by providing the halls and equipment necessary to hold trials remotely, which eased the burden on the Dubai Police General Command by compressing the expenses of transporting detained and imprisoned suspects and averting the risks of transferring them from one side to another. On the other hand, Dubai Police assisted the court in providing remote courtrooms in all its centers and presenting them at the specified dates. The Public Prosecution was the best mediator between them by providing the appropriate administrative staff of session secretaries and training them in order to complete the litigation process and speed up the settlement of cases.

Cooperation with legislative bodies in Dubai

Creation of a Full Circuit by the Civil Court

Civil Court of First Instance:

Insolvency applications and applications for settlement of financial obligations used to be distributed to all civil court circuits according to the total value of debts in the request. In 2022, the Court of Cassation in Dubai Courts issued iudicial rulings defining the court competent to hear insolvency requests and requests for settlement of financial obligations as the full circuit in the civil court, given that such requests are not valued.

Based on that change, the Civil Court took the initiative to establish a full circuit specialized in these applications and to refer all requests considered in other circuits to the new circuit.

Real Estate Court of First Instance: Accurate Judgments and Speedy Adjudication

- The establishment of the technical office at the Real Estate Court contributed to managing the process of unifying judgments and applying modern principles to judicial circuits, which was reflected very positively on the indicator of the accuracy rate of judgments.
- The formation of the Hotel Apartments Committee in coordination and cooperation with the Dubai Courts Experts Department, which positively affected the rate of accuracy and consistency of judgments based on the different points of view among the experts.

- Focusing on long-term ongoing lawsuits, which reflected positively on the indicator of the percentage and age of the current lawsuits that exceeded one year.
- Launching an initiative to re-examine the requirements for registering lawsuits related to the off-plan sale of real estate units, by adding a requirement to register these lawsuits by attaching a recent real estate inquiry issued by the Land Department to support the requests in such lawsuits, which had an impact on the speed of adjudication of this type of lawsuit.

The Commercial Court is characterized by the fact that most of the cases it handles are related to technical issues. so the procedures have been facilitated by applying the Procedure Law in a smart way through the expertise circuits, where these files are taken and placed in the departments and finished on the same day. This distribution reduces the delay in the expertise and ensures control over these circuits.




Legal Flashes Initiative Legal Opinions that Address the Needs of Staff and Customers

Quality services and speed of response were provided,



Leadership Talk

An program hosts a group of judges and employees with experience in strategic dimensions that contribute to supporting knowledge for Court employees on the personal and professional levels through discussions managed by the Knowledge Management Department,

with the aim of consolidating communication between the leadership and Courts employees, supporting the knowledge methodology and transparency policy of Dubai Courts, in addition to encouraging specialists to share their experiences with all employees.

First Session:

Consolidate Communication Between the Leadership and Courts Staff and Support the Knowledge Methodology and Transparency Policy of Dubai Courts

The President of the Court of Cassation explained during the session that the United Arab Emirates has provided members of the judiciary with all the capabilities required to perform their duties in upholding the banner of justice as it is one of the most important pillars of good governance, stressing the keenness of Dubai Courts to align all its initiatives and operational plans with the ambitious vision of the Dubai government, through employing modern technology in order to improve performance in a way that achieves the aspirations

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and visions of the wise leadership to reach highlevel government services.

Second session:

Dialog session with the Executive Director of the Notary Public and Settlement Sector

During the session, the Executive Director of the Notary Public and Settlement Sector emphasized the importance of the dialog sessions in sharing the experiences and expertise gained over the course of the professional career. He also touched on his journey working in the Dubai Courts, and excerpts from his personal, academic and practical biography, and indicated that man was created in this life to suffer and face adversity and challenges, and God Almighty has provided him with the capabilities and means that help him to overcome them, and this is what we must do, especially in light of crises that the world is going through in recent times, and that these challenges facing man in his life path are, in fact, opportunities for him to rise and proceed from them to make more achievements in various fields.

Government Accelerators

Documentation and approval of the reconciliation agreement (initial stage)

This initiative aims to implement Law no. 18 of 2021 Regarding the Organization of Reconciliation Works in the Emirate of Dubai by documenting the settlements of government agencies and providing them with the strength of the executive document, as 195 reconciliation agreements were approved during the year, which contributed to raising the reconciliation rate and accelerating the rate of adjudication of disputes.

Accelerating the Completion of Expertise Files

This initiative aims at accelerating the completion

of the expertise files registered in the Center by developing a plan to improve work systems and simplify procedures, which contributed to raising the annual completion rate of experts, as 83% of the experience files assigned last year were completed, while to date 84% of the files of expertise assigned have been completed.


"Performance Order"

This service allows litigants to register a lawsuit in case the right of the creditor and the claimant is established in writing and at the time of performance has come, whether it is a debt of money of a specified amount or a movable debt of a specific type and amount, and he may submit a payment order or file an ordinary lawsuit.

Adverseness-Ending Decision

The project aims to amend the terms of reference of the Center for Amicable Settlement of Disputes and judicial procedures in terms of considering and deciding disputes in which the value of the claim does not exceed AED five hundred thousand. It has led to saving time, effort and money for the customers, reducing the pressure on the competent courts of first instance, and adopting settlements and amicable agreements of any value to assign them the strength of the executive document without judicial fees.

The implementation of this project has reduced procedures, saved money and effort on administrative organizational units, and sped up adjudication, as shown below:


This initiative seeks to contribute to spreading legal culture, enhancing communication, and supporting the network of relations between courts and partners to support specialized legal awareness and enhance legal awareness among society groups by publishing the legal principles issued by the Court of Cassation.


This contributes to enhancing the community's confidence in the judicial system by establishing an integrated platform that serves as a basic reference for clarifying the rights and duties of community members.



In a step aimed at opening the doors of communication with those concerned in the judicial field, and employing modern technology to convey what is happening in the judicial field, Dubai Courts issued the quarterly judicial and legal magazine Echo of Courts, under the supervision of His Excellency Tarish Eid Al Mansouri, Director General of Dubai Courts.

The aim of launching the magazine - of which four issues have been published so far - was to enrich the judicial material with its originality and novelty, to benefit from its applied aspects, and to provide judicial personnel and their assistants with knowledge that helps upgrade their professional performance.

The magazine includes a set of legal chapters that include articles and research written by specialists and experts, which aim in their entirety to disseminate and enhance legal awareness, and to promote knowledge exchange in the judicial field through legal materials edited in a journalistic manner so that any reader can understand its materials. It is published every three months in both Arabic and English.

Mohammed bin Rashid Issues Law Regulating The Provision of Digital Services in Dubai

On 5 April 2022, the Dubai Government Media Office website announced that in his capacity as the Ruler of Dubai, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE, has issued Law No. (9) of 2022 regulating the provision of digital services in Dubai. The Law seeks to accelerate the emirate's digital transformation, enhance the provision of digital services, and promote the digitisation of services in both the public and private sectors. Pursuant to the Law and its decisions, government entities and judicial authorities, including Dubai

Courts and Dubai Public Prosecution, as well as non-government entities in Dubai, are required to provide digital services to their customers. The Chairman of The Executive Council of Dubai will issue a decision on the various stages of implementing the Law, in line with the recommendations of the Digital Dubai Authority, provided that the decision includes specifying the date for the start of the application of each stage, the digital services and the entities covered by each stage, and the controls and procedures for their implementation.



Amendment of Law on Judicial Authorities

The Dubai Government Media Office also announced on 9 December 2022 that in his capacity as the Ruler of Dubai, His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE, issued Law No. (24) of 2022, partially amending Law No. (13) of 2016 concerning the Judicial Authorities in Dubai. Pursuant to the new Law, the Judicial Inspection Department has been renamed the Judicial Inspection Authority. The title of the head

of the Authority has also been changed from the Director of the Judicial Inspection Department to the President of the Judicial Inspection Authority, wherever they are mentioned in the Judicial Authority Law and applicable legislation in Dubai, In addition to new texts related to defining the grades and job titles of members of the judiciary, citizens and non-citizens, in the Courts, the Public Prosecution and the Judicial Inspection Authority, according to the table set forth in the law.

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Hamdan bin Mohammed Issues Resolution on Arbitrators In Personal Status Cases in Dubai

The official website of Dubai Courts also published a news article on 21 April 2022, entitled "Hamdan bin Mohammed issues Resolution on arbitrators in personal status cases in Dubai", stating that His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai and Chairman of The Executive Council of Dubai, has issued Executive Council Resolution No. (16) of 2022 on arbitrators in personal status cases in Dubai, which applies to cases related to separation on the grounds of detriment and breach as outlined in Federal Law No. (28) of 2005 on the Personal Status Law and its amendments.



Under the Directives of Mohammed Bin Rashid Maktoum Bin Mohammed Launches Special Court of Inheritance within Dubai Courts

On 18 April 2022, Dubai Media Office website published a news article titled: "Under the directives of Mohammed bin Rashid Maktoum bin Mohammed launches Special Court of Inheritance within Dubai Courts ", stating that His Highness Sheikh Maktoum bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Deputy Ruler of Dubai, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Finance and Chairman of the Dubai Judicial Council, has launched a Special Court of Inheritance within Dubai Courts dedicated to handling inheritance cases. The new
